Fairfield County 4-H Fair	All members should participate! The Fair book listing regulations, awards and classes is distributed to members in Aug. This is an opportunity to exhibit anything members have made, grown or worked on during the year. All exhibits are judged on the Danish system and ribbons are awarded. Special awards are given in each division.
Fall Festival at the 4-H Farm	Held at the 4-H Farm in Bloomfield. Exhibits, demonstrations, product sales, hayrides and refreshments
Eastern Regional Horse Event, KY	A state team is selected to represent our state in this comprehensive test of horse science knowledge (such as identifying horse items, judging, facts and equipment, identifying breeds, etc.)
UConn Cornucopia Fest	University of Connecticut College of Agriculture and Natural Resources Open House - Storrs campus. Workshops, exhibits, fun. Public Welcome.
National Dairy Conference	CT delegates are selected on the basis of CT 4-H Recognition Forms, county recommendation and state interviews. National Award trip

ACTIVITY	DESCRIPTION
Volunteer training	An opportunity for all adult volunteers and teen in leadership positions to learn about the 4H club program, 4-H club organization, new policies procedures, program planning, teaching techniques, community service, craft ideas, parliamentary procedure, etc.
National 4-H Congress	Congress happens in Atlanta and is a state award trip. Approximately 1,200 outstanding 4-Hers from across the nation participant in this 4 day recognition, cultural and education event. CT delegates are selected on the basis of CT 4-H Recognition Forms, county recommendation and state interviews.
State Teen Leadership Weekend	Open to all teens statewide. Workshops and leadership activities-important for fair officers, teen committee members, anyone interested in improving leadership skills

## DECEMBER

ACTIVITY	DESCRIPTION
CT Recognition Forms Due	For all teens interested in being selected to attend National 4-H Conference at the 4-H Center in late March or to attend Citizenship Washington Focus in July.
Fairfield 4-H Spring Benefit Horse Show Ad Campaign Begins	4-H'ers sell sponsorships and ads for Benefit Horse Show to be held in May. Funds raised from this support all County 4-H programs.

County 4-H Fashion Revue	All clothing members are eligible to participate. Senior members are selected to take part in the state clothing revue held later in the spring. 4-Hers may sew a piece of clothing or be a "Smart Shopper"
County 4-H Talent Show	Held in conjunction with the Fashion Revue to provide a showcase for any 4-H member's or 4-H group's talent. Registration materials are usually out the first of January. Start working in projects in December.
State 4-H Poultry Show	Held at UConn- open to all poultry youth
State 4-H Horse Symposium	Held at UConn. This week-end event features speakers, demonstrations and exhibits related to all aspects in the Horse industry.
State 4-H Dairy Project Clinic, UConn	Members with dairy animals are eligible to participate in this clinic, held at UConn, Storrs.
National 4-H Conference	Outstanding 4-H members from across the state are chosen in the spring for recognition to participate in national events such as the National 4-H Leadership Conference, or 4-H Youth Congress. Members are selected on the basis of the CT Recognition Form submitted in January.
